MAYOR JOSEPH M. DESTEFANO: Hi, good evening. Tonight, we have the honor of some special guests. And with that were presented with awards at the Orange County, the 2024 Orange County Youth Bureau Award recipients from the City of Middletown. And we have the Odyssey of the Mind champion from Monhagen School. Where is she? Oh, there you are. Alexa Ocasio, who's going to say a few words and call up the folks and award them with their certificates. Alexa, it's all yours.

ALEXA OCASIO: Good evening. My name is Alexa Ocasio, and I am currently a student at Monhagen Middle School where I participate in modified volleyball, Odyssey of the Mind, and the National Junior Honor Society. At the Recreation and Parks Department, I participate in various programs, and I am also a member of the Middletown Mayor's Youth Council.

On Wednesday, June 5th, Superintendent

of Recreation, Raelynn Bertholf, along with assistant to the superintendent, Nicole Psarakis, and program coordinator, Celines Rodriguez, attended the 42nd Annual County Executive Youth and Adult Awards Program hosted by the Orange County Youth Bureau and its advisory board.

Back in February, the Recreation Department nominated community members, employees, and youth for various award categories. The following people were award recipients at the 42nd Annual County Executives Youth and Adult Awards program. Not all awardees were able to attend tonight. We still want to recognize everyone. Daniel Higbie is the general manager of Mid-City Transit and devotes countless hours to our community. He is a member of several local service groups and chairman of the Recreation Commission. If there is a community event, you can guarantee that Dan arranged for Mid-City to

be a part of it. Daniel Higbie was the award recipient of the Asset Builder Outstanding Business Community Partner Award. Thank you, Dan, and Mid-City, for all that you do for our community.

Jessica Rodriguez, a recreational specialist at the recreation and parks department, special education teaching assistant at the Maple Hill Annex, volunteer youth coach and mother of four was a recipient of the adult category for Asset Builder/Outstanding Youth Worker Award.

Linda Coleman, Cathy Prezioso, and Denise Billings of the Middletown Garden Lovers Club were recognized for their volunteering with the Middletown Recreation's, Little Wrecker Toddler/Preschool Program. They bring encouragement and curiosity for nature, arts and crafts, literacy, and song to our two and a half to three and half youth. They are recipients of the Betty Jane Polanis Asset Builder/Adult Volunteer Award.

seniors of Middletown High School Class of 2024, recreational leaders for programs and events and lifeguards for the City of Middletown, each received certificates of honor in the youth category for Outstanding Leadership, Volunteerism, Citizenship for their varying activities, leadership, and enthusiasm to be a voice to their peers and the younger youth members of our community.

Joseph Galdamez, an eighth-grade student at Twin Towers Middle School, a member of the Middletown Mayor's Youth Council and member of the Middletown Recreation's Young Warriors Boxing Club was a third-place recipient of the youth's category, Positive Change Leading to Success Award. He is a role model for youth, not only because of his age -- not only his age but younger and works to encourage all across his school. Young Warriors Boxing Club, Boy Scouts, Mariachi ensemble, and to his younger siblings.

The youth category for Outstanding Leadership, Volunteerism, Citizenship Certificate of Honor was awarded to Monhagen Middle School eight grade student, Aniston Flynn. Aniston is the secretary of the Middletown Mayor's Youth

SUPERINTENDENT OF RECREATION RAELYN

BERTHOLF: I just want to thank Alexa Ocasio for agreeing to do this. Yes. And if we could just have all the award recipients present to come up front just so we could take a picture with the council members. That's right, everybody.

WOMAN 1: Everybody look ahead.

PRESIDENT J. MIGUEL RODRIGUES: All right. We're going to go back to the Good of the City. If anyone else would like to address the council, please step forward. All right.

Remarks of the mayor.

MAYOR JOSEPH M. DESTEFANO: I'll be pretty brief tonight. First, I'm sure you saw in the Times Herald Record that we had a bid opening or a request for concept and qualifications opening for the redevelopment of 1115 King Street. And the proposals were opened at the Board of Estimate on June 13th.

The building, as you know, is being sold or transferred as is and all proposals needed to submit an acquisition price along with a projected use.

We did receive three proposals: one from Denali Ventures LLC, which proposed a \$500,000 purchase price along with a mixed-use development; 135 North Street Inc. proposed an acquisition price of \$1; and Northern Medical Center Inc. proposed an acquisition price of \$350,000, again, with a mixed-use development.

So, the committee, which will be the next step, is to -- the review committee, will be

established to evaluate the proposals. And the goal is to have a recommendation before you at the Common Council on or about the July 16th meeting. So, we're looking forward to the transfer of that property and the rehab of that property.

If you're not familiar with it, it's right across the street, the gold brick building on the corner.

Also, we're happy to announce that the -- we did a list a series of warming -- or cooling centers -- I'm sorry, not warming. We don't need a warming center -- cooling center throughout the county, and Thrall Library was the one that the county had designated in their Facebook post. But unfortunately, tomorrow is -- not unfortunately. It's a holiday, but unfortunately, the library is closed tomorrow. And we will -- so, we scrambled with the county and through Maria Bruni's office and Rick with some help also to meet with the GMIC. Maria met with the GMIC who does the warming center operation. And we're going to reopen the warming center, going to become a cooling center at least for some days when we hit this Code Red, which is

the number that the state declares a health emergency.

So, for the next two days, June 19th and 20th, both, even though the library will be reopened, we hope to relieve some of the burden from them and have the cooling center be open from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. at 8-10 Mulberry Street. The county will be participating with some staff. We will also be paying for some staff through the GMIC. And we'll be using some of the community development grant to pay the staff directly because it's our facility. We want to make sure we have people there.

Also, tomorrow from 3:00 to 5:00 p.m. is the Fourth Annual Juneteenth Festival here in the City of Middletown. It will be at John Degnan Square. There's performances by different groups, different -- I think Kofi and Sankofa and a whole bunch. But it's really an event that has grown over the last few years. I want to thank Sadie's Bookstore, Yaa Yaa Williams and Anthony Williams for all they've done for the past three years and including this year four to make this event come about. It'll be from 3:00 to 5:00, and then at 5:30, at the Paramount, will be a

free community screening of Origin. So, please come on down to Downtown Middletown.

Just for the record, sanitation will be on regular schedule because for the City of Middletown, the union chose not to take Juneteenth as one of their 13 union -- holidays. That option was given to them, and they rejected it. So, City Hall, City of Middletown Government Offices are open tomorrow. So therefore, there will be no delay in garbage pickup.

So, that's all I have unless you have any questions.

PRESIDENT J. MIGUEL RODRIGUES: Any questions for the mayor? Thank you, mayor.

PRESIDENT J. MIGUEL RODRIGUES: Thank you.

PRESIDENT J. MIGUEL RODRIGUES: Remarks from the department heads. Economic Development.

DIRECTOR OF ECONOMIC AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT MARIA BRUNI: Just a couple of items. We have two new businesses opening this week at 7 North Street, Bella Moon Star Fashion Boutique. So, we're going to have a ribbon cutting on Friday at 5:00. And Saturday at 1:00, 28 North Street, Mr. Croissant will be opening. So, I

look forward to seeing you all there and we'll be sending out our posts and everything later this evening.

And just a reminder, Sheila E is coming to the Paramount, June 28th, the queen of percussion. So, tickets are still available. Contact the Paramount. That's all I have.

PRESIDENT J. MIGUEL RODRIGUES: Any questions for Maria? Thank you, Maria. DPW Commissioner.

COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC WORKS JACOB TAWIL: Good evening, everyone. Alderman Masi, the reservoir level is 97 percent. We're in very good shape. Today we have some good news that we went to Orange County Transportation Council. We were, you may recall, awarding WSP contract for \$1.4 million in there for the inspection for the third year of the construction. Today, we went to Orange County Transportation Council, and they awarded us the one -- basically the full \$1.4 million in there. So, the City does not have to pay any of that except for a percent of coverage between five percent and 20 percent depending on which part of money is going to be coming from, whether it qualifies for (indiscernible) fund,

which means we're responsible only for five percent of it. Otherwise, because the state will pick up the 15 percent.

So, make a long story short, great news today. We got \$1.4 million. There's one more vote remaining to make sure that DOT checks everything, dots the Is basically, and crosses the Ts, but we got this money. And before you there is a couple of resolutions for awarding the bids for surplus equipment and vehicles. We are in support of it and wish you will support it too. Any questions for me?

PRESIDENT J. MIGUEL RODRIGUES: Any questions? Thank you, Jacob.

COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC WORKS JACOB TAWIL: Thank you.

PRESIDENT J. MIGUEL RODRIGUES: Police Chief.

POLICE CHIEF JOHN EWANCIW: Good evening. One of the agenda items this evening is a change in local law which we spoke about earlier this evening. Just for clarification, we cannot enforce that except for anybody of the age of 16 or older. So, I know we had a brief discussion about some children. So,

unenforceable there.

This June 8th, we hosted the Kids Day Celebration in the Thrall Park. I just want to, you know, thank everyone that came out and supported that, and also thank Officer Patricia Galli for all the hard work that she put in to organize that. I know a lot goes into it. Her heart and soul goes into it. It was her brainchild, and she's continued it for many, many years. So, I definitely appreciate that. And we've seen a pretty significant increase in attendance over the last several years. So, thank you.

For those that have seen it, some have asked about it, some have inquired, is the department just recently acquired -- we purchased two camera trailers. We have one located right now -- they were delivered to us last Thursday. Very similar to what we deployed last December in the Park Circle area as we were demoing it. We ended up going with a different vendor, which we thought was more feasible for the organization and the City.

So, we purchased two of them under a grant, and one is deployed at the intersection of

Wickham and Wisner in the parking lot of the gas station, which is a very high-volume area. And one is deployed on Robert Street along the side of Erie Way, backside of the church and the bar there due to some recent issues there.

The cameras are amazing. They feed into our existing camera system that was already established in the building. And they all have - - each of the trailers has five independent cameras that we could, you know, zoom in in certain areas and, you know, cover a lot of areas.

So, we definitely like those that get your attention. We're hoping that they're more of a deterrent than anything else. They have a little flashing strobe light on them, you know. They have insignia on them. But we're definitely looking forward to being able to utilize them to deter some stuff and to hopefully prevent additional criminal activity.

Other than that, I have nothing unless you have something for me.

PRESIDENT J. MIGUEL RODRIGUES: Any questions for the police chief? Alderman Kleiner.

ALDERMAN GERALD KLEINER: Yeah, could we just remind people about fireworks in Middletown? And one of our constituents said that he got, in the mail, an advertisement from Keystone and Matamoras and they sell everything, I mean, all across the board. So, reminding people that although sparklers are legal in some parts of the state, they're not legal in Middletown, and that explosive devices are not legal anywhere in New York State. So, if you're thinking of bringing those in across the border, it's just a reminder. We have one meeting before the Fourth.

POLICE CHIEF JOHN EWANCIW: I think you just said it best. None of that is allowed. So, none of it is allowed. As far as the mailing, I can't control that. It's not criminal to receive a mailing. I'm sure there's some connection there to why. But as Alderman Kleiner said, fireworks in the city of Middletown are not authorized in no form, no type. Even if you buy them in another location legally, they are not legal to be utilized, possessed here in the City of Middletown. The council approved the local law several years ago and we will be out

enforcing it as we have in the last several years.

We are putting together our plan for the Fourth of July week with additional resources to make sure that we could do our best to adequately address the fireworks that are being utilized in the city.

PRESIDENT J. MIGUEL RODRIGUES: Thank you, chief.

POLICE CHIEF JOHN EWANCIW: You're welcome.

PRESIDENT J. MIGUEL RODRIGUES: Anyone else? Thank you, chief. Superintendent of Recreation.

SUPERINTENDENT OF RECREATION RAELYN BERTHOLF: Good evening. I have nothing tonight. It's kind of hard to follow Alexa Ocasio. She did an amazing job. Any questions?

PRESIDENT J. MIGUEL RODRIGUES: Any questions? Alderman Kleiner.

ALDERMAN GERALD KLEINER: Thank you. Also, from our constituents' meeting, our question is about pickleball. Would you explain to people, because I don't think we've said that at a meeting, that the pavilion is now, when it's

not the farmers' market, that you do have a pickleball court set up under the pavilion roof. So.

SUPERINTENDENT OF RECREATION RAELYN

BERTHOLF: Yes. Just like you said, the pickleball court is up, it's lined, it's there underneath the Erie Way Pavilion. It is open to the public any time besides during the farmers' market or any other special event that the city is hosting. I have yet to see anybody there. A few people that I know, word of mouth, that they've been calling and asking and we let them know, but we still haven't seen anybody there yet.

CLERK: Good evening. I just want to give our community and the elected officials an update. We know that there have been a number of problems with the broadcasting of our council meetings and city meetings on our Cable Channel 20. Eileen has been working diligently, as have

I, with the Spectrum company trying to resolve it. But they seem to be moving quite slow. And I was told just last week that it was not a high priority for them because it is a non-revenue-generating service that they're providing to us. At which point I reminded them that the Federal Communications Commission thinks otherwise, and we've now looped Congressman Pat Ryan's office in on this issue, trying to get the service restored or at least identify what's causing it so we can be able to provide those broadcasts to our community.

So, we are aware that there's a problem. We are trying diligently to fix it. And I hope to have an update for you guys by the end of July.

As you are aware the DEC will be moving away from printing sporting licenses on special license paper (valeron) and moving to printing on 8 1/2" x 11", plain white paper. This change is scheduled to occur between July 15, 2024, and August 1, 2024. Due to this, we have amended the License Issuing Agreement. In order to keep your DECALS account active, you will need to complete the enclosed amendment and return it the Revenue Accounting Unit no later than July 15, 2024. If we do not receive your location's amendment by July 15, 2024, your DECALS account will be disabled prior to August 1, 2024, and will remain disabled until a completed amendment is received.

A. Allow the License Issuing Agent to retain a portion of each license sold as prescribed in Department laws, rules, and regulations.

B. Provide appropriate training and training materials to the Assistant License Issuing Agent, including a toll-free telephone "help desk" service to answer questions and assist with problems.

C. Provide informational materials, in a hard copy or electronic format, for use at the approved location for the License Issuing Agent and their authorized employees to distribute to hunters, anglers, trappers, etc. regarding regulatory requirements for all authorized licenses issued.

2. Article 4. Agent Representations is hereby replaced as follows:

4. **AGENT REPRESENTATIONS**

The Agent hereby agrees that it will:

A. Provide authorization attached hereto as Attachment "A" for the Department to access a bank account for electronic fund transfers to pay for all licenses sold. Fund transfers shall be scheduled on a regular basis as determined by the Department.

B. Pay all amounts due to the Department. Failure to maintain an adequate balance in the License Issuing Agent's account may result in immediate termination of this Agreement.

C. Provide a compatible computer system including a plain paper printer and access to the internet at no charge to the Department.

D. Indemnify and save harmless the Department and the State of New York from and against all losses from claims, demands, payments, suits, actions, recoveries, and judgments of every nature and description brought or recovered against it in a court of competent jurisdiction, to the extent such loss is attributable to a negligent omission or tortious act of the License Issuing Agent, its agents, or employees, in the performance of this Agreement.

E. Be solely responsible for the supervision and direction of the performance of this Agreement by the Assistant License Issuing Agent and other authorized license issuing employees other than as specifically provided herein.

F. Alert the Department if the License Issuing Agent, Assistant License Issuing Agent, or other person issuing licenses is convicted of a misdemeanor or felony level criminal offense.

G. Not allow a person convicted of a misdemeanor or felony level criminal offense to issue licenses or have access to the license system, unless the person's conviction has been reviewed by the Department.

3. Article 6. License Issuing Conditions is hereby replaced as follows:

6. **LICENSE ISSUING CONDITIONS**

A. All licenses authorized to be sold pursuant to this Agreement may only be sold by the

License Issuing Agent, the Assistant License Issuing Agent, or authorized employees of the License Issuing Agent at the approved location set forth in this Agreement.

B. All employees authorized to issue licenses by the License Issuing Agent pursuant to paragraph "A" of this section, shall be appropriately trained in the use of the license issuing system and the business rules associated with the sale of sporting licenses and the entire DECALS sales catalog by the Assistant License Issuing Agent prior to using the issuance system.

C. At the Department's discretion, the Assistant License Issuing Agent will be required to take Department sponsored DECALS training as well as take and pass tests associated with training.

D. The License Issuing Agent and his/her employees who are authorized to issue licenses pursuant to this Agreement must abide by New York State Regulations 6 NYCRR Part 177 and 6 NYCRR Part 183.

E. All funds received from the sale of licenses, less any fees established by the Department, will be held in trust for the Department. Monies collected from the sale of licenses are Department funds and any other use of such funds is prohibited. The License Issuing Agent accepts the responsibility and duties of trustee for all funds collected for the benefit of the Department under this Agreement.

F. No license may be sold for a fee in excess of or less than the amount established by the Department.

G. The complete catalog of sporting licenses must be available for sale to the public at the License Issuing Agent's approved location as designated in this Agreement.

4. Article 7. Change in Ownership is hereby replaced as follows:

7. CHANGE IN OWNERSHIP

In the event of a change in ownership of the License Issuing Agent's business, the Department must be notified 30 days in advance of any such change, and this Agreement becomes immediately terminated at the time of such change in ownership. This License Issuing Agent's appointment is not transferable and shall apply only to the License Issuing Agent's appointment to sell sporting licenses.

5. Article 10. Termination is hereby replaced as follows:

10. TERMINATION

In addition to any termination event appearing elsewhere in this Agreement, or provided in the applicable Department regulations, the following shall apply:

A. This Agreement may be terminated for cause if the Department determines that any false statements or omissions were made on the License Issuing Agent's application.

B. This Agreement may be terminated for cause for failure to comply with the terms of this Agreement at any or all approved locations at any time by the Department.

C. Either party may terminate this Agreement for convenience by 15 days written notice to the other party. Per ECL § 11-0713 municipalities must request authorization from the Department to terminate the agreement and cease selling sporting licenses.

D. In the event of termination of this Agreement, the License Issuing Agent shall pay for all licenses sold and not previously paid for within 30 days of such termination.

E. Termination for Non- Responsibility: Upon written notice to the License Issuing Agent, and a reasonable opportunity to be heard with appropriate Department officials or staff, the Agreement may be terminated by the Commissioner or his or her designee at the License Issuing Agent's expense where the License Issuing Agent is determined by the Commissioner or his or her designee to be non-responsible. In such event, the Commissioner or his or her designee may complete the contractual requirements in any manner he or she may deem advisable and pursue available legal or equitable remedies for breach.

F. In the event of a change in the appointment of the Assistant License Issuing Agent, the License Issuing Agent shall notify the Department of such change within 15 business days by submitting to the Department a completed revised License Issuing Agent Application Form attached hereto as Attachment "B," which shall provide, among other things, the name and title of the newly appointed Assistant Licensing Issuing Agent. In the Department's sole discretion, this agreement may be suspended or terminated in the event the Department is not notified of any change in appointment of the Assistant License Issuing Agent as provided herein.

6. Article 15. Confidentiality of Personal Data is added as follows:

15. CONFIDENTIALITY OF PERSONAL DATA

A. All personal data provided by customers shall be kept confidential to the extent required by Law.

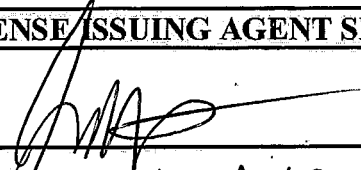
B. The License Issuing Agent will ensure that access to the Departments sporting license system is limited to the License Issuing Agent, Assistant License Issuing Agent, and staff at their location who they have authorized to use the system and who have been trained by the License Issuing Agent or Assistant License Issuing Agent, in the business rules regarding the sale of sporting licenses as well as system functionality.

C. Use of the sporting license system is limited to official business as it pertains to sporting licenses and the entire DECALS sales catalog.

7. All other terms and conditions of the License Issuing Agent Agreement as amended will remain in full force and effect.
