Looking to have a ribbon cutting for the Reservoir Mountain Bike Trails. Working on a date.

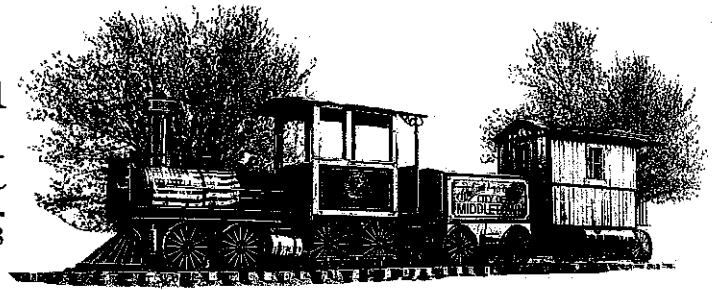
